Guide to Copenhagen – Sportmonda Bowl version

We would like to emphasize that this is suggestions and recommendation, there is plenty of other ways to enjoy your stay in Copenhagen. This is focused on a stay from Friday to Monday and with Sportmonda Bowl as the main focus.


Public Transportation

Let's begin here, because this will influence my recommendations.


A great site to know is <u>www.rejseplanen.dk</u> (it can also be reached via. <u>www.Journeyplanner.dk</u>). This will help you plan your journey. You can search on street address or station/bus stop name. The advantage of Rejseplanen in comparison to Google maps is it has more traffic updates e.g., is the trains running on time and so on.

There are four means of public transportation in Copenhagen.

Metro which run to the Airport and covers most of the city center. There is currently four lines. One crossing the City starting at the Airport, one starting at Vestamager and crossing the City, and two going in a circle around all the key points in the City center. It takes roughly 15 minutes to go from the Airport to City center.



S-train which is useful for Sportmonda Bowl as it goes from our field (located near Ny Ellebjerg Station) to the city center in less than 10 minutes.

Then we have intercity/regional trains and busses. The trains are useful if you want to go from the Airport directly to the Central Station without using the metro or if you have more time and wish to visit other areas than Copenhagen. The busses run all over town, they even have boats crossing the harbour, it's a cheap way to go on the water.

Copenhagen has two main stations: Nørreport and København H (Copenhagen H/Central Station). The first is connected directly to the Metro going to the airport, while you can take intercity train directly from the Airport to the Copenhagen H. You can access the fields directly from both stations using the A line (E is not running in the weekend) to Ny Ellebjerg, it will run every tenth minute. The stations are close to each other - 1,7 km in walking distance.

What about tickets?

There are multiple options. I would say this depends on your team.

We have the classic 24h, 48h, 72h, 96h CityPass solution, that most larger cities have. There is a large and small ticket. The small should cover most/all needs. It covers transport to and from the Airport and to and from the fields. This might not be the cheapest way, but it sure is convenient.


What about Biking?

Copenhagen has won the award for most bicycle friendly city in the World multiple times. Up to 62 % of inhabitants bike to work or school every day. We have huge bike lanes on most streets. There are multiple places to rent bikes, and a lot of hotels are either renting or including them. If this is something you want to try, then I would suggest finding a hotel like that. It's free to bring your bike on the s-train, while you need to pay to bring it in all other means of public transportation.

Where to stay?

This brings us directly to the main question. Where to stay? This depends. If you are going by car and have no real interest in seeing Copenhagen. I would go for a hotel with free Parking, that is close to the fields. I would suggest the area around Sydhavnen. There are some hotels in the area e.g. Scandic Sydhavnen, A & O and Moxy and even Bellasky (Scandinavia largest hotel) is within reasonable driving distance.

If you arrive by plane and are not planning to rent a car (which you probably should not), then I would recommend the area around our Central Station (Copenhagen H), as described in the transportation part, it is very easy to reach from the airport and the fields. Furthermore, there are a lot of different hotels in all price ranges and a great supply of restaurants. It also has the benefit of being within walking (or biking) distance of most sights in Copenhagen.
